SISTER ELECTA ROBERTS

Sister Electa Roberts died at St. Mary's Hospital, Minneapolis, Minnesota, on March 31, 1964, in the sixty-fifth year of her age, and the forty-minth of her religious profession.

Sister's death came suddenly and unexpectedly. She taught as usual until 3:15 P.M. on Friday. As she locked her classroom door that evening little did she realize that it was the last time she would do so. On Saturday morning she did her assigned duties. That afternoon, on meeting her superior, she remarked that she did not feel well, but thought possibly she was getting the flu. However, her condition grow worse during the night, and she was taken to St. Mary's Hospital, where the physician pronounce har condition serious, though not critical. She was anointed and members of her family were notified of her illness.

The best medical care, the attention of devoted murses, and the prayers of the entire community centered on Sister. God answered these prayers according to His will; after having the joy of a final visit from her brother, Mark, of Ottawa, Canada, and her sister, Sister Electa, of the Sisters of Mercy, Syracuse, New York, Sister entered into eternal life.

Sister's religious life was devoted to the apostolate of the classroom.

Her teaching assignments included St. Mary's, White Bear Lake; St. Cecilia's,

St. Paul; St. Mary's, St. Paul; St. Theresa's, Hastings; Christ the King,

Minneapolis; Our Lady of Lourdes, Minneapolis; St. Anthony, Minneapolis.
