Sister St. Leo Praught 1907 - 1997

Born to Louise Malone and Leo Praught, October 21, 1907, Kathleen began life in Grand River, Prince Edward Island, Canada, in her family of two sisters and ten brothers.

In 1930 she entered the Sisters of St. Joseph, and in 1932 began her long service as teacher, principal and superior. In the classroom she was kind, exact, and knew how to bring the best out of her students. Many years after being in her class, students and their families were loyal to Sister St. Leo.

During summers she taught CCD and visited her beloved Canada. After her retirement from teaching, she retired to the Provincial House where she served as assistant coordinator and sacristan. In her work in the sacristy, no detail escaped her notice — as always, she was capable and organized.

Always generous with her time, she was a wonderful cook and a thorough house cleaner. Never strong, Sister St. Leo was nonetheless a hard worker. In the midst of her busy days, she found time to visit sick sisters and parishioners.

Throughout her life Sister St. Leo was "a community woman" — always loyal, interested in the spirit and concerns of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

Sister St. Leo died at Bethany on Fri., Nov. 7. Visitation was at Bethany on Mon., Nov. 10, with Mass of Christian Burial on Tues., Nov. 11. Interment was in Resurrection Cemetery. She is survived by her sister, Mrs. Harry (Marion) Beeston and brother, Louis.
