ORAL HISTORY PROJECT

Sister Georgia Morrison (Funeral Homily by Father Joseph Kuncl)

March 3, 1971

FJK: Sister Georgia Morrison was born in 1874 in September 8, 96 years ago. Her life was admirable in this day, for her devotion to duty. Sister was 27 years of age when she began to live the life of a postulant, in our community, in 1902. . . . She stepped across the threshold of the postulancy, already prepared in maturity. That maturity which is essential for all of her days as a religious. She made a life long commitment to God. Her first mission was at St. John's Hospital in Fargo, North Dakota, and then she went to the College of St. Catherine in 1906. She was a means of help to all, in her life there at the college. She formed a vital part of the community there, and her personality was cheerful, and was a guide to the girls there. She set a scale of priority, and what distinguishes wisdom from mere philosophy, was her acculumation of knowledge. She led her life according to that scale of priorities. . . . Those of you who knew Sister Georgia so well, through all the years, have your own memories. I dare say that you would all agree that these words do tell something of the working of the Holy Spirit in Sister Georgia. "Her days are filled with the great gift of Wisdom." Sister Georgia was very familiar with the tradition of St. Catherines where she shared her wisdom with many that she lived with there, and met there. Many were loved and guided by her. . . . Many pondered what direction their life should take, and Sister Georgia would counsel them. . . 8 years ago she came to Bethany, to get ready to go to God. . . fullness of the christian life that sister Georgia lived with such empathy. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
